The end of the 5th grading period is April 20th.

LATE START

IN-SERVICE DAY

PARKING PASS APPLICATIONS

Applications for parking passes for the 2012-2013 school year will be emailed out in the middle of May to parents who have parent connect access. If you do not have parent portal access you can print them off the Preble Website. The applications are due back on June 8th. Students must have a valid driver's license before they can hand in an application. All fees/fines and restricted time/detentions must be paid/served before applications will be accepted.

GUEST WIFI ACCESS

A new connection named "Guest" is now available when accessing the internet. The "Guest" connection will present users with an End User Agreement screen which requires the user to click "Accept" to indicate that the user will abide by the District's AUP. Internet access through "Guest" will be at the more restricted student internet access level.

TUTORING ASSISTANCE

On-site tutoring assistance is now available for all Preble students Monday through Friday via a grant through NWTC. Students may receive help during their lunch hours or study halls. Please encourage your child to seek help as needed through their Guidance Counselor.

UNHEARD VOICES: SPEAKING OUT AGAINST SEXUAL VIOLENCE

JUNIOR/PARENT/COUNSELOR MEETINGS

Parents and guardians of juniors will meet with their guidance counselors to review transcripts and discuss post high school plans. These are called an Individual Planning Conference or IPC. These conferences will assist parents and their children to prepare for their future whether they are going into the work world, military, technical, or four-year colleges. This will be a great opportunity for parents and juniors to start planning their senior year and beyond. Questions will be answered and resource materials will be available. If you have not done so, please call 391-2402 to schedule your Individual Planning Conference.

JUNIORS-COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS

Juniors are encouraged to take their college entrance exams, ACT/SAT, in the spring of their junior year. Tests can be taken more than once, if necessary. The ACT is now the most commonly used test, but the SAT may be required for some out-of-state schools. **Preble High School's school code, 500-795, needs to be included on the ACT/SAT registration form so that test scores can be added to the student's official transcript.** Stop in the Career Center to research college requirements. Registration packets are available in Student Services and/or visit the website <u>www.actstudent.org</u> (ACT) or <u>www.collegeboard.com</u> (SAT).

SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE

For some scholarships, like Scholarships Inc., a Student Aid Report (SAR) is required to complete their scholarship application. The SAR is received once the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, or FAFSA, is completed and processed. Please contact your school counselor if you have further questions.

SUMMER SCHOOL OFFERINGS

This year's summer school offerings are now available and offer a lot of variety. Students can take courses in one of two sessions: June 11 - July 13 or July 16 – August 10. The Student Services Office has course information and registration forms. For just \$13 a course, high school students can get credit for physical education, health, personal and financial literacy, language arts, social studies, physical science, biology, and more! Credit is not offered for camps or classes that are not offered during the school year.

 Don't forget the popular Freshman Forward for incoming 9th graders in August!

Summer school forms can be completed online, or can be mailed to the Green Bay Area Public Schools Office Building at 200 South Broadway by the appropriate deadline. In the event that a course will not be offered, enrollment fees will be returned. Students who register for courses by the general registration deadline will know by the first week of June if there was sufficient enrollment to hold the course.

The Department of Public Instruction limits the amount of time a student can spend in summer school to 4.5 hours per day. Any student interested in summer school is expected to attend <u>every day</u> - family vacations are not considered excused absences. Summer school is not the best option if these plans are already in place.

Registration runs until courses are full. Once classes are full, students will be selected by a lottery system. If you have questions, please contact your school counselor at 391-2402.

Course Descriptions for Summer School 2012

(Course # PRB2) Bridge to Spanish 2 (Enrichment Course)

*This course is open to any student who is enrolled in **high school Spanish 2**, **including incoming 9th graders**, for the 2012-2013 school year. The course will review the vocabulary, grammar and culture needed to successfully enter level 2 with ease and will present practice in listening, speaking, reading and writing.

*This is a **two-week course** to be held at **Preble** from **9 until Noon** each day during the **first two weeks of each session.**

Session 1, from June 11 through 22 (Monday – Friday, 9 until Noon) Session 2, from July 9 through 20 (Monday - Friday, 9 until Noon) There must be at least 12 students signed up for the course to run.

(Course # PRBAP) Bridge to AP Spanish (Enrichment Course)

*This course is open to any student who is enrolled in the **AP Spanish course at Preble High School** for the 2012-13 school year. The course will review the knowledge and skills students should have to begin an AP-level class in the Fall, and will present practice in all the communicative areas of listening, speaking, reading and writing.

*This is a **two-week course** to be held at **Preble** from **9 until Noon** each day during the **last two weeks of Session 2.**

Session 2, from July 16 through 27 (Monday - Friday, 9 until Noon) There must be at least 12 students signed up for the course to run.
